john calhoun martin is believed to have been born in 1830 somewhere in tennessee he married sara jane scott 1832 in 1855 they stayed in tennessee and raised their family john fought for the confederate army and was probably a wheelwright desecendants and their 1987 reunion are the subjects of this material many of his descendants now life in texas as well as tennessee

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
